

Selecting the Right Fern

Though we tend to think of ferns as being all of one type of plant, in reality two species of fern can be as different as night and day. Choosing the right type of fern based on your site conditions can be the difference between a lush, vigorous plant and an unhappy camper. As a rule, ferns prefer shade; however many can tolerate sun as long as their moisture requirements are met.

Christmas Fern – *Polystichum acrostichoides*

Leatherwood Fern – Dryopteris marginalis

Miss Vernon's Lady Fern – Athyrium felix-foemina "Vernonia Cristata"

Polypody Fern – Polypodium vulgare

Male Fern – Dryopteris affinis


Ostrich Fern – Matteucia pennsylvanica
